Walter Cronkite's Secretary

On a sunny March morning I had the pleasure of driving into the forest near Shelton to the West Coast Latvian Education Center where I found the home of Harijis (Harry) Saukants. He is the On-Site Manager for the camp and lives in the middle of this peaceful forest location. The camp exists for the purpose of organizing educational and cultural events for people of Latvian ancestry. Harry is Latvian and his journey from Latvia to the United State and Volkssporting is a fascinating story.



Harry was born and grew up in Latvia. He graduated from a five year business high school with fluency in not only Latvian, but Russian, German, and English. He was living in Latvia when Russia occupied it from 1939 - 1941, and remained in Latvia during the German occupation. He left Latvia, as did thousands of Latvians, when the Soviets returned in 1944 because he remembered the cruelty of the Soviets' previous occupation. He went to Germany where, after WW II, he was an interpreter in the American Zone for the U.S. military and various businesses. For a time he was secretary and interpreter for Walter Cronkite in Germany.

Physical activity has always been a big part of Harry's life. He taught Latvian folk dancing for 16 years and was a cross country ski instructor for several years at Mt. Hood, Oregon. In 1988 he was cross country skiing at

Mt. Adams and saw a group of cross country skiers registering and stamping books and asked what they were doing. They were Volkssporters and Harry has been a Volkssporter ever since then (30 years). In 1993 he was one of the first members of the Portland, Oregon, club and was an active

member there until 1999 when he moved to Shelton. He then joined the Capitol Volkssport Club and has been a member since 1999 (19 years).

Harry hasn't been walking with CVC for about five years. The last two walks he did with the club

were the strenuous Colonel Bob Trail in the Quinault Rain Forest and the Lake Union walk in Seattle. Harry accumulated 16,000K cross country skiing and walking. A couple of years ago at the CVC annual picnic he was awarded a lifetime membership in Capitol Volkssport Club. The club recognized his long time participation in the club and his faithful publication of the monthly newsletter even after he had stopped walking.

In March Harry celebrated his 93rd birthday and retired from publishing the CVC monthly newsletter. Capitol Volkssport Club sincerely thanks you, Harry, for the pleasure of knowing you, and for your devotion to Volkssporting!




