I was a new member of CVC and thought it unusual that so many people would go to the beach to walk in the winter. We split up into groups each testing a different walk route. As I walked along in the wind and rain, I realized that the weather would be similar in February 2015 and that it was a unique idea to put on a walking festival at the beach in the middle of winter. What an odd, optimistic group of people I had decided to hang with in my retirement!

Cold, wet, and hungry, we all met at Mike's Seafood for lunch after we were done working on our assigned routes. I began to understand the appeal of spending three hours in the cold winter air walking and then enjoying a well-deserved warm meal with friends. The following February I volunteered at the Seabreeze Walking Festival and had a wonderful time. There were 375 participants that year and the weather was sunny and mild.

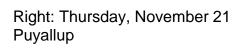
