Beverly Bridge / Palouse to Cascades State Park Trail By Barb Malone

On April 8, Tom and I attended the opening dedication of the Beverly Bridge spanning the Columbia River near Vantage. State Parks promised the ceremony would be held regardless of weather conditions. So of course, we had very strong winds with gusts up to 60 mph. The winds made for a very exciting walk over the bridge and back. Dignitaries that day included Governor Jay Inslee, Ralph Monroe, the Buck family representing the Wanapum tribe, State Park officials, Washington Horse Riders, Cascade Trail Coalition (bike riders) and the Department of Archeology and Historic Preservation. Music for the ceremony was provided by the Mattawa High School Band who were first to lead the walk over the bridge. The 3000 ft bridge provides a critical link on the Palouse to Cascades State Park Trail for pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders. Pedestrians are no longer required to make the crossing over the I-90 bridge at Vantage. To date 285 miles of the trail system have been completed across our state. It will eventually connect to the Great American Rail Trail to make a 3700-mile corridor...the longest rail trail in the nation. Originally the bridge was part of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railway built in 1909. Called the "Milwaukee Road", it connected Chicago to Tacoma. It was used by one of the first electric trains. Beverly Bridge was taken out of service by 1980 and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1982.
