This year we have already had some smoky days and, unfortunately, I think that we may have more as the hot weather continues. Below is some information from the internet to help you make good decisions about whether to walk or not.

Air quality is measured with the Air Quality Index or AQI. The AQI works sort of like a thermometer that runs from 0 to 500 degrees. However, instead of showing changes in the temperature, the AQI is a way of showing changes in the amount of pollution in the air.

N95 masks don't just protect against COVID, they also protect against pollution. According to Women's Health, those higher-quality masks can filter out the small particles associated with smoke pollution.

Watch for signs that air pollution is affecting you, such as coughing and shortness of breath. Asthma sufferers should keep quick-relief medication handy. On days when the AQI is more than 300, everyone should avoid outdoor physical activity and remain indoors.

Stay safe out there and enjoy our wonderful Pacific Northwest trails and scenery.

Anderson Island Walks: Saturday, August 5, 2023

Take a summertime ferry ride to visit this nearby, south Puget Sound Island. There are two walk routes available: a 7K and an 11K. The 7K route, which is on the north end of Anderson Island, begins by walking on to the ferry in Steilacoom. It follows quiet country roads with views of Puget Sound and Mount Rainier. Because this is a Traditional Event, the walk credit fee for CVC members is \$3. **Start time:** 8:45 am – 12:15 pm. **New Start location: Steilacoom Perkins Park & Playground**, 201 7th Street, Steilacoom, WA – just off the traffic circle at Union Ave & Martin Street, one block from the ferry terminal.



The 11K route on the south end of Anderson Island requires driving on to the island. You'll explore trails in three parks, visit beaches, learn history of homesteaders on the island and enjoy beautiful view of Puget Sound and Mount Rainier.

Parking for the 7K is available at a pay lot directly behind the Anderson Island Ferry Terminal in Steilacoom (56 Union Ave, Steilacoom) Price: 10.99 plus tax. Most street parking in the town of Steilacoom is limited to 2 hours, maximum. There is also a large free parking lot on Anderson Island at the ferry terminal, if you decide to drive on to the island. There are small free parking lots at the 11K start point, Andy's Wildlife Park, and a couple of blocks south at Jacob's Point Park.

We will try to find a restaurant, where we can dine together that evening. Closer to the date we will ask for a head count, in order to make the dinner reservation. Thursday morning may feature one of the Ocean Shores YRE's and then a walk of the Hoquiam YRE on our way home.

It's not too early to reserve a room! Yes, some or all of the motels will take reservations already for August of next year. We advise you make your reservations now at a place, which will allow you to cancel later, if you are unable to attend.
