1. Pam Greig-Davis reported on the next ESVA challenge, to be called "Tell Me a Story," which will include libraries, bookstores, reading rooms, or any place selling printed material, and will start in 2025. She pointed out that it was Peter Sweet's initial idea of bookstores for a challenge that led to the eventual category, so thank you to Peter!

To decrease the costs to ESVA for printing directions, etc. for the September Walkfest on Kitsap Peninsula, Pam requests to once again borrow library card numbers and passwords from all who are comfortable letting her use them for the monthly allotment of printing that we all get from Timberland Library. She said to please get back with her by email or text, both of which are listed on the CVC membership roster you will have received via email from the club.
3. The July Meeting Minutes were approved as written.
4. The Treasurers report, sent via email on 6 August, was approved.
5. Back to the Beach trip, coming up starting Tuesday, 13 August-Thursday, 15 August, presented by Bonnie Tucker. She reminded everyone that they should have received an email on 1 August with the list of walks, and also the other information which included a description of the road detours that are in place this month for construction. They are well marked, but members should allow more time, both to get to Ocean Shores, and also on Wednesday to get to the beaches farther North on the peninsula. Note that all the Ocean Shores walks will change to Traveling Guided walks next year, and so will not be readily available. She notes that all walks will cost \$3.00. Approximately 30 people have signed up so far.
6. After an appeal for further topics, none others were brought up for discussion, and the meeting was adjourned.
