

Capitol Volkssport Club Membership Meeting Minutes

1. Club officers elected at the May 2026 meeting are as follows:

Bonnie Tucker was also re-elected as the ESVA South Sound Area Coordinator.
2. Karen Younkings was thanked for her four and a half years of service as Club President and Mary Clem for her two years serving as Secretary.
3. The minutes of the May 14 meeting were approved as posted on the website.
4. Pam Greig Davis gave the Treasurer's report. The club's finances are a little ahead of normal due to the bump in revenues generated by Wild and Woodsy. Additional Wild and Woodsy revenue may trickle in from the Online Start Box. The total balance on hand at the end of June was \$9,190.74. Upcoming expenses include the second quarter's AVA dues and the storage compartment rental. Right now, the club's finances are in line to break even for the year.
5. Members gave reports on walks they had taken.
6. Mary Clem gave a report on the June Bellevue walk. Approximately 20 people attended, including 5 from the Interlaken Trailblazers Club.
7. The future meeting schedule was discussed at length. The members present approved a motion from Pam Greig-Davis that the club continue to have meetings every other month until the end of the year and that the opinions of other club members regarding the matter be solicited in the meantime. There will be club meetings in September and November.
8. Ginny Miller and Chuck Andrews agreed to bring treats for the September meeting.
9. The President reported that he had been working on some proposed by-laws changes to remedy what he sees as problems with the existing club bylaws. He will share these with the members in the future.

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10. Ginny Miller reported that she had sent out two cards. One was to Diane Malone, who fell on a Panorama walk and cracked a bone in her leg. The other was to the family of former member Pat Brower, who passed away. It was suggested that a card be sent to Pat Harmon, who has moved to a memory care unit in Vancouver.
11. Two walk binders have disappeared from the file cabinet at Bayview. It is not known how or where they went.
12. Bonnie Tucker gave her area coordinator's report. Daffodil Valley is having a 40th Anniversary walk on Saturday at Clarks Creek Park. The walk is free and there will be refreshments. August 15th will be the Mount Rainier walk starting at Cougar Rock Campground and going to Longmire and back. August 29th is the Vashon Island redo of the Troll Walk. Nov. 7 will be the Pipeline Trail walk in Tacoma. Nov. 21 is a year-round walk in Raymond. Attendance at the Flaming Geyser State Park was only 37. Daffodil Valley has a new website.
13. It is time to pay club membership dues. Sheila Morrison is collecting them. Make checks payable to Capitol Volkssport.
14. There is a sign-up sheet to help out with the August 20 Summer Picnic at Squaxin Park.
15. Pam Greig-Davis gave a promotion for the ongoing ESVA walk review challenge. From April 1 to September 30, anyone who completes a walk review for a sanctioned walk (list is on ESVA website, along with the review form) will be entered. The top two reviewers will receive \$75 and \$50, and two others will be drawn from a hat for \$25 prizes.
16. It was noted that Pam Greig-Davis has a stock of supplies for walk boxes that are available to box tenders.
