One of these walks might turn into an event for CVC or a regular everyday walk.

I would like to thank Chase Davis for editing the Northwest Pathfinder for the last several years. He and his team have provided us with a won-



derful publication every two months which included all the year round events in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Alaska. Chase is still sending us the upcoming walks through Meetup, and we can access information through the AVA website, the Evergreen State Volkssport Association website, Facebook, and our everyday walks through the Capitol Volkssport Club website.

This spring I have been lucky enough to go on some Dambo troll walks on Vashon Island, West Seattle, and Issaquah. Since 2013 Thomas Dambo, the self-described "semi-good" artist, has built and hidden more than 120 giant trolls in 17 countries. Each one is whimsical, magical and with a message for everyone living on our planet. Thomas Dambo's "Northwest Trolls" include six giant troll sculptures located in various spots around Washington and Oregon. The trolls, made entirely of recycled materials, are part of an environmental story and are meant to encourage exploration and find these trolls in locations like Bainbridge Island, Issaquah, West Seattle, and Ballard. Trolls are installed for three years and may stay in their locations longer, if the host organization so chooses.

Celebrate Trails Day—Volunteer Opportunity


Chuck Andrews participated on Saturday, April 26th from 10:00 am— 12:00 pm, in a work party on the Foothills Trail where a group of 60 volunteers came together and planted 200 native trees along the Foothills Trail between the East Puyallup and McMillan Trailheads—a project that will improve wildlife habitat, protect stream health, and enhance the trail experience for everyone who uses it.

The Foothills Coalition is seeking volunteers for their next stewardship work party where they will return to care for the trees they planted, continue removing invasive blackberries and even plant more trees this fall.

REMINDER OF 2025-26 CLUB DUES



On the Road Again Part 3—by Diane

After Antarctica and the first of a 2 week recovery from the RSV illness at my brother's home in Goodyear AZ we continued to Sedona AZ for the second week of recovery. Unfortunately, I was not able to do my favorite 2 Sedona YREs—just no energy and respiratory issues. So 2 weeks with no walking — it was mentally excruciating!

We then started on our trip to San Antonio to meetup with 2 of my 3 female cousins and their father, my last surviving Howell uncle, for a mini—reunion as well as time with our son and 3 grands. On the way we spent time in Santa Fe NM, where now that my health had returned, I was able to walk the Santa Fe Capital, Santa Fe College/Museum, Los Alamos and 2 Albuquerque YREs. It was great to move my body again in cool but sunny weather.


For the first time ever on an annual road trip my husband had to make an emergency trip home from El Paso to troubleshoot our all-house generator as a winter storm and numerous power outages had ceased operation of our in-ground well which we share with the daughter of the family that previously owned the property we bought back in 2005. Despite troubleshooting by our neighbors a circuit board was blown and the digital error code was hidden from view by all until the Generac repairman visited. So after 5 days at home, a circuit board bypass installed by Generac Services, and confirmation water was flowing to both residences, Rick flew to join me now in San Antonio.

Two days after Rick joined me in San Antonio, I flew to Salt Lake City (SLC) to join a fellow Puget Sound Genealogy Society member and attend the annual 3-day RootsTech Genealogy Conference as well as spend 4 days at the LDS FamilySearch Library researching an ancestor in the American Revolution and 3 ancestor sisters that were accused of being witches in Salem MA. So I am now a member of DAR and currently documenting the required evidence for membership in the Associated Daughters of Early American Witches.

When I returned from SLC I was able to walk a couple of the San Antonio Riverwalk YREs before we moved to the hidden WorldMark gem in Stablewood Springs TX. My youngest cousin (62 yo) walked the Riverwalk a few times with me and my oldest granddaughter. She also walked on her own a few times and later with her husband when he joined us in SA. For once my son and grands were able to meet some of my family members for a family meal with, of course, world-famous TX BBQ. The last time they saw my son was when he was 18 months and they were elementary school students! At the end of the reunion my youngest cousin returned to DE with info on the First State Webfooters club. Highlight for me: I completed the El Camino de San Antonio Missions Trail and earned my 30k credit towards the Camino Ingles and received the certificate signed by San Antonio's Most Reverend Archbishop Gustavo Garcia-Siller.

As soon as our family visit in San Antonio ended we began our trip home with of course a stop in Las Cruces NM to attend the AVA 23rd Biennial Convention. Great walks, great fun, amazing socials and food, old friends, new friends and new suggestions for Special Programs! Trip Stats: 11/26/2024 to 5/9/2025; 165 days; 5 month 14 days; 11,685 miles in the car; 17,238 flight miles to and from Ushuaia Argentina and SLC trip; and 1,928 nautical RT miles from Ushuaia to Antarctica.
